## This funding will be used to


- Increase percentage of students achieving A-C in English and Maths to 15% A, 30% B, 45% C in Yrs 1-6
- Ensure every student who does not meet the school's P-2 Reading benchmarks is identified and is engaged in targeted intervention and support
- Ensure every student accessing a different year level curriculum (that is, with an Individual Curriculum Plan) will achieve a 'C' standard or better against the relevant year-level achievement standard in English

## Our initiatives include

- Develop teacher knowledge and understanding of the P-10 Australian Curriculum content descriptors and achievement standards by designing and supporting processes for teacher collaboration in planning, assessment and moderation

- Develop teacher knowledge and understanding of explicit teaching practices by designing and supporting processes for teacher collaboration in data literacy, targeted teaching and measuring impact

- Develop a plan for monitoring early phase literacy and numeracy, including the schedule of Early Start assessments, opportunities for professional conversations regarding student progress and strategies for intervention

## Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Investing in additional specialist teachers to release each year level for 80 mins each week to:
    - analyse student data, collaboratively plan for targeted teaching, identify measures for impact and moderate practice \$156, 831
  - Implementing targeted intervention programs, EALD and reading, for at risk students in foundation skills development \$76,650
  - Increase speech support for identified students \$ 20,000
  - Provide resources for the Student Support Services Team to meet the needs of identified students \$ 20,000
  - Employ a Youth Worker to provide social and emotional support for identified students as part of the school inclusion model \$ 55,000
